Given the structure of the program, we recommend you submit a factum on behalf of the applicant, appellant or moving party. A respondent's factum is also acceptable, but not encouraged. It is imperative that the sample not relate to matters currently before the courts. If necessary, all identifiable information can be blacked out or changed.

The writing sample should be stapled with your name clearly marked on the front page. You do not have to include supplementary documentation and appendices. You must bring one (1) copy of your sample with you to edit during the course. Participants who use computers to draft may wish to bring their notebook computers to use during the workshop.

If you have not yet written a factum, written argument or other court submissions are also acceptable. Articles and/or other written prose are not acceptable. If necessary, you can contact Heather Gore at 416.597.8847 or hgore@osgoode.yorku.ca to discuss what other material may be appropriate.
