LLM SPECIALIZING IN CONSTITUTIONAL LAW

The degree requirements will be satisfied upon the completion of 36 credits. There are two options for completing this degree:

Option I [36 credits]

- The **required courses** for Constitutional Law [9 credits];
- 21 additional credits of coursework, at least 15 of which must be courses from the Constitutional Law-related electives*
- A Major Research Paper (70 pages) in the Constitutional Law field [6 credits]
- Advanced Legal Research Workshop**

Option II [36 credits]

- The **required courses** for Constitutional Law [9 credits];
- 27 additional credits of coursework, at least 21 of which must be courses from the Constitutional Law-related electives*
- A Significant Research Paper (30 pages) as a means of evaluation for one of the Constitutional Law required courses or -related electives**

Students are advised to consult the [term schedules](#) for additional course offerings outside of the Constitutional Law required courses and -related electives (up to six credits of these course offerings can be taken during students' period of enrollment).

** The Advanced Legal Research Workshop is required for all students who wish to complete a Major Research Paper and does not count towards the 36 credits required to complete the degree. The Advanced Legal Research Workshop is not required for students writing a Significant Research Paper but is strongly recommended in order for students to review writing and research skills. In general, the Advanced Legal Research Workshop is offered every term. Please consult the [term schedule](#) for dates. The **required courses** for Constitutional Law are:

- Constitutional Theory [3 credits]
- Constitutional Remedies [3 credits]
- Evidence and Procedure in Constitutional Litigation [3 credits]

Students are responsible for completing 36 credits by taking the required courses and choosing from the elective course offerings, subject to the degree requirements above.
