## LLM SPECIALIZING IN ENERGY AND INFRASTRUCTURE LAW

The degree requirements will be satisfied upon the completion of 36 credits. There are two options for completing this degree:

### Option I [36 credits]

- 18 credits from the **core course** offerings.
- 12 additional credits of coursework, at least 6 of which must be from the core courses or Energy and Infrastructure Law-related electives\*
- A Major Research Paper (70 pages) in the Energy and Infrastructure Law field [6 credits]
- Advanced Legal Research Workshop\*\*

### Option II [36 credits]

- 18 credits from the **core course** offerings.
- 18 additional credits of coursework, at least 12 of which must be from the core courses or Energy and Infrastructure Law-related electives\*
- A Significant Research Paper (30 pages) as a means of evaluation for one of the Energy and Infrastructure core courses\*\*

\*\* The Advanced Legal Research Workshop is required for all students who wish to complete a Major Research Paper and does not count towards the 36 credits required to complete the degree. The Advanced Legal Research Workshop is not required for students writing a Significant Research Paper but is strongly recommended in order for students to review writing and research skills. In general, the Advanced Legal Research Workshop is offered every term. Please consult the [term schedule](#) for dates. - Regulatory Theory [6 credits]
- Public Utility Law [6 credits]
- Changing Paradigms in Energy Regulation [6 credits]
- Demand Side Management: Policy and Regulation [6 credits]
- Urban Infrastructure Planning and Regulation [3 credits]
- Comparative Approaches to Energy Development [3 credits]
